Understanding DFH DMAP Reports

Delaware First Health is pleased to continue to offer customized reports which allow providers to confirm if the provider data submitted on claims matches what is registered with DMAP. **Beginning with the January 2024 report, providers can now confirm if the provider information submitted on the claim is “engaged” according to the December 2023 DMAP engaged list.**

Below is guidance on how to access the updated report, an overview of the report, and how to best use the report.

Access the Report:

Sign in to [Delaware First Health Provider Portal](#), scroll down to the bottom and click on the “Reports.” Download the latest version of the “DMAP Registration Report.”

Overview of the Report:

Column	Description
Columns A & B	Provider type (billing, rendering and/or attending) submitted on claim under TIN Column B
Columns C & D	Provider names (pulled from claims) for each NPI/taxonomy/address location
Columns E & F	NPI and taxonomy submitted on claim to Delaware First Health
Columns G-L	Address type and full address billed on the claim, including 9-digit zip code
Column M	First MCD that matches criteria (NPI, taxonomy and zip for billing; NPI and taxonomy for rendering and attending)
Columns N & O	Indicates if MCD ID match with DMAP is found (Yes, Probably Yes, No, TBD) and explanation
Column P	Suggested action to take assuming provider is billing correctly
Columns Q & R	Number of paid, denied and pended claims
Columns S&T	Indicates if NPI/taxonomy matches the engaged list (Yes/No) and explanation of engaged status (Non-PASA providers)
Column U	Indicates if NPI matches the engaged list (Yes/No) (PASA providers only)

How to Best Use the Report

- Prioritize the registration of providers who will continue to receive denials because they are not registered (column N is “no”) and not engaged (column S is “no”).
- Share your customized DMAP report and our updated [CCA Validation guidance](#) with the individuals responsible for credentialing and billing to ensure they understand the requirements.
